



The Old Enfield Charitable Trust Community Grant Application

Grant Selection Criteria

Please read this section carefully before completing your application. The activities of the Trust are constrained by our geographical area as specified.

To be successful, applicants must:

Live or operate within the boundaries of the Old Enfield Charitable Trust and serve in large part our client population.

Be a Registered Charity/CIC/ Community Group

Be a group or Individual acting for the wider benefit of the local Community and/or supporting local community initiatives to relieve poverty and hardship for our client population.

These activities should be beneficial to the local community, improving quality of life and promoting community cohesion.

Successful Applicants

Applications are welcomed from groups including local community, self-help, voluntary groups, and charities or individuals acting for the benefit of the local community, whose primary focus clearly falls into the following categories:

- a) Children: supporting appropriate activities, as well as promoting healthy lifestyles, e.g. healthy eating, sport, and extra curricular activities.
- b) Elderly: supporting appropriate activities, promoting healthy and active lifestyle, while combating social isolation.
- c) Health promotion: e.g., promotion of healthy eating, active lifestyle, and psychological and emotional well-being. We would aim to support activities for disadvantaged and disabled groups.
- d) Homelessness/Poverty: supporting those affected by homelessness, poverty and poor housing.
- e) Arts & Culture e.g. community music festivals, and other community arts projects.
- f) Environment: promoting a clean/healthy environment
- g) Grants are more likely to be granted for items of capital expenditure, or as a contribution to a specific event or project.



Exclusions:

- a) Multiple applications – only one application for the same event or one application per organisation may be supported in one calendar year.
- b) We are not normally able to fund or partially fund salaries or ongoing expenses.
- c) Where funding for premises and activities is normally from Local or National Government departments, e.g. Health and Education, (Hospitals and Schools) we would not furnish a grant.
- d) Groups which use their surplus for the benefit of an individual or business.
- e) Overseas Charities
- f) Applications from religious bodies will only be considered if there is a wider benefit for the local community, and open to all.
- g) Funding Raising for Political Parties activities will not be supported.

Grants Terms & Conditions

The Old Enfield Charitable Trust (TOECT) may ask you for extra information to support your application.

Only part of the requested Grant may be awarded. You will need to specify how you will fund the project that is not covered by our funding.

The amount of grant awarded is final and will not be increased if you overspend or have calculated your costs incorrectly.

Any grant which is not spent within six months of being awarded will be withdrawn.

TOECT will settle appropriate accounts directly with suppliers on the applicant's behalf and all invoices and receipts should be addressed to TOECT,

TOECT may ask you to return the grant in full if it is found that the grant has been used inappropriately.

A copy of your latest accounts will be required.
